

SHIPPING NEWS.

A rough night but no marine mishaps in the harbor. The bark Doon sailed from Holyhead Dec 17 for Honolulu. The schooner Carrier Dove sailed from Newcastle Dec 17 for Honolulu. The steamer Kanal took 300 tons of coal to Makaweli yesterday afternoon. The steamer Waiialeale brought in 9459 bags of Kilauea sugar this morning. The bark Alden Besse which lay abreast of the wind was tugging hard at her hawsers all night. Through the deflection of a water pipe the floor of Oceanic dock was slightly flooded last night. The Mowers sighted a four-masted barkentine this morning sailing in the direction of Honolulu. The steamer Hawaii brought 4700 bags of Paubau sugar and 50 head of cattle from Low's ranch yesterday. Bill Williams sloop was taken away from her anchorage during last night's gale and afterwards picked up without much damage. A lot of lime in barrels caught fire from spontaneous combustion last night on Brewster wharf. The fire was extinguished by the custom house guards. The launch Annie during the Kona last night broke her moorings just off the boat house and was swept on the marine railway's cradle. She was rescued this morning. The bark Matilda was to have left Port Blakely two days after the bark Ceylon sailed out of the straits. The Matilda is loaded with lumber for Allen & Robinson. In view of the Ceylon's experience fears may well be entertained for the Matilda as she is a very old vessel and cannot stand much rough weather. The American bark Ceylon, Calhoun Sr master, after a rough passage of 28 days from Departure Bay with a cargo of coal for Allen & Robinson, docked at the Mall wharf at six o'clock last evening. The Ceylon had thirteen days of the nastiest kind of weather and the fore-castle, cabin and galley were full of water. Captain Calhoun thought he would never get here and says it is the worst voyage he has ever experienced in his forty years of life on the ocean wave.


