

THAT HILO LAND CASE.

EDITOR BULLETIN:—The following are extracts from the closing argument of Hon. Gilbert F. Little, of Hilo, attorney for plaintiff in the case of Jos. Vierra vs. the Bishop of Panopolis and Emil Wery. Vierra had, years ago, leased, from the Catholic mission in Hilo, a lot of property on the principal street of that town. The lease expired and Vierra produced documentary evidence to prove that he had a right of renewal, at the same rate, for a further period of fifteen years. The mission people, however, denied this, and refused to renew the lease on various grounds.

Vierra had left the Catholic church and become a Protestant. His attorney takes the ground that his failure to secure the renewal was on account of his conversion to Protestantism. In the lower courts the mission obtained a verdict in their favor. An appeal was taken and the following is taken from the winding up of Col. Little's argument:

Vierra *** has performed his part well. He has demanded, prayed and hoped for the admeasurement of his just rights according to correct principles. But in vain. His crime was one calling to the Pope for vengeance. It was becoming a Protestant, leaving that great red-handed octopus in which there is neither reason, mercy nor honesty, stepping out into the valley of independence to let the light of reason shine upon him, daring to think for himself on matters of his own highest and dearest concern. This is why they would not give him the lease. He said the Bishop was a liar to promise him the lease and then deny it. The Bishop admits he lied, that he deceived the Appellant. If he did the case is ours. (See Bishop's testimony.)

The trial and condemnation of Jesus by the Great Sanhedrin, which Court had jurisdiction of judgments in souls and punishment under the administration of the law, by the Jewish theocracy, as it existed when Jesus lived and died, very forcefully reminds us of this case. Without even remotely permitting ourselves to appear impious, we may be allowed to invite a comparison to show the tyranny, prejudice and bigotry that is apparent in both cases. The crime of Joseph Vierra was that he sought, in the Great Code, given by God Himself to His chosen people, a religion of the heart, and repudiated the absurd formulas of Papal dogmatism and superstition. For this alliance with a code of moral precepts, he is to be destroyed by the inexorable and relentless tyranny of the Roman Catholic Hierarchy for no better or more rational or honorable motive than was Jesus tried for blasphemy. It was because Appellant left the domain of the Roman Catholic Church that he is now refused a new lease; no other hypothesis will


