

SHIPPING MOVEMENTS

THE STAMSHIP MONMOUTHSHIRE ARRIVED TODAY.

The Barkentine Kikikat Outward - Steamers Hawaii and Waialeale - Other Notes.

The S S Monmouthshire from Portland was sighted at one o'clock.

The barkentine Kikikat sailed at nine o'clock this morning for Puget Sound in ballast.

Tomorrow, high tide large 5:35 a.m.; high tide small 5:15 p.m.; low tide large 11.9 p.m.; low tide small 6:20 p.m.

The British bark Ladis. Captain Robert Dixon, has cleared for San Francisco with 570 tons rock and sand ballast.

The Chilean government is offering liberal inducements to Englishmen to serve in its navy as first and second mates.

The steamer Hawaii arrived in this morning with 5556 bags Panama sugar, which was put into the brigantine W. W. Irwin and ship Troop.

The schooners Ka Moai and Kaikikoni put No 1 and 2 circle D sugar into the barkentine S G Wilder today, completing her cargo. The Wilder will sail tomorrow for San Francisco.

The men working in the hold of the Galamborough were standing in two or three feet of water while shoveling coal today. The engine was again started this morning, and pumped water steadily.

"They do these things better in France," doesn't always apply to the building of warships, for the iron-clad Carnot of twelve thousand tons is a complete failure.

The Echo de Paris says of her, "Owing to the limited space, it is found impossible to accommodate the crew under good hygienic conditions, and in consequence of gross errors in the calculation of different weights, which the Superior Council of Naval Construction did not detect, she sinks below the water line to such an extent that her armor belt is immersed. No such conditions exist in the ships of the American navy."

The points of the compass may be determined with the aid of an ordinary watch. It is simply necessary to bring the watch in a position so that the hour-hand is directed toward the sun. The south then lies exactly midway between whatever hour it may happen to be and the numeral XII on the dial.

Let us suppose for instance that it is four o'clock, and that the triangle is held in the position indicated. The direction of the numeral II will then be the exact south. If it be eight o'clock the numeral X will indicate the exact southern point.—Cleveland Marine Review.

The statistical summary of vessels totally lost, condensed, etc., now published by Lloyd's Register, shows that during 1895 the gross tonnage of the effective mercantile marine of the world amounted to 127,777,000 tons, excluding all vessels of less than 100 tons. Of this total, 340 vessels of 372,438 tons were steamers, and 95 of 48,215 tons were sailing vessels. These figures exceed the average of the preceding four years by 64 steamers of 81,210 tons, and by 55 sailing vessels of 24,900 tons. As regards steamers owned in the United Kingdom the return is also above the average, while as regards sailing vessels it is somewhat below. The increase in the case of the former is due not to actual vessels but to the large tonnage broken up on coasts, etc. Apart from such cases, the United Kingdom steam tonnage lost during 1895 is only equal to the average of the last four years, notwithstanding that since 1891 the tonnage owned has increased by one and a half million tons.
