

SHIPPING MOVEMENTS

THE STEAMER W. G. HALL FOR MAUI AND HAWAII.

Markentine Archer Outward Bound - Barkentine W. H. Diamond Inward Today - Passengers.

The Kanai takes a load of coal to Makaweli, Kanai, this evening. The Keathou goes to Koloa, Kanai, tonight with coal and machinery.

The schooner Ka Mo'i landed 3000 bags circle D sugar at Oceanic dock today.

Tomorrow, high tide large 5:10 a.m.; high tide small 5:30 p.m.; low tide large 5:17 p.m.; low tide small 6:37 p.m.

The W.G. Hall sailed this forenoon with a full cargo and about the usual number of passengers. She was a little late getting off.

The barkentine Archer, Calhoun master, sailed this morning for San Francisco. She took a few thousand bags of sugar, only enough for ballast.

The barkentine W. H. Diamond, Nilsen master, arrived this morning, 13 days out from the Golden Gate. Besides a general cargo, she brought over thirty head of livestock, 14 of which are for Mr. McCandless and 12 for the H. M. brothers.

The bark Albert was cleared yesterday for Honolulu with a general merchandise cargo. Among the principal shipments were the following: 100 lbs tinplate, 6400 lbs lard, 135 cgs groceries and provisions, 1400 bbls flour, 22 cgs dry goods, 9 cgs clothing, 30 cgs hardware, 670 cgs and 50 bbls salmon, 744 bales hay, 110 cgs beer, 400 bbls lime, 3049 lbs oats, 50,490 lbs rolled barley, 3539 lbs corn, 80 cgs canned goods, 21,544 lbs barley, 6 cgs hams and bacon, 50 bales suit, 15 cgs canned fruit, 90 cgs wheat, 154 gals oil, 3440 posts, 7 horses, 2440 gals wine, 300 cgs coal oil, 100 boiler tubes, 3910 lbs shalfs, 1045 lbs meal, 431 gals and 35 cgs whisky, 100 cgs crackers, 57,031 lbs bran, 20,000 lbs middlings, 3 bbls hose, 4864 lbs sugar, 12,921 lbs beans, 100 bbls paper. - S.
