THE P. M. S. CITY OF PEKING IN PORT.

Steamer Kinau Arrived This Morning - Other Vessels Inward and Outward - Notes of Interest.

City of Peking leaves at 10 p. m. The Mikahala leaves at 3 p. m. for Nawiliwili.

The Keahou will sail at 10 a. m. Monday for Oahu ports.

The German bark Ardgowan arrived at Port Townsend Feb 8.

On the 7th inst the barkentine Klinkit arrived at Pt Gambie.

The Hawaiian bark Leahi was wrecked at Kahului last week.

The Iwalani will depart at 10 Monday for Lahaina and Hamakua.

Fred Harrison is supplying the bark Routenbeck with stone ballast.

The Pacific Mail liner City of Peking from San Francisco arrived off Koko Head at 12:30 last night, and entered the harbor a couple of hours later. She brought a number of passengers for this port, and has a moderate list for the Orient. She is taking in several hundred tons of coal, and will sail tonight at 10 p. m. for Yokohama.
