## TEN THOUSAND TONNER.

To Be Built for the P. M. S. Co.'s Oriental Trade.

According to the San Francisco Chronicle, C. P. Huntington will shortly begin the construction of a 10,000 ton steamship for the Pacific Mail Steamship Company at his shipyard at Newport News. The steamers City of Rio de Janeiro and Peru will be taken off the run between San Francisco and the Orient and the new steamer, which will compare favorably in tonnage and speed with the big ocean greyhounds of the Atlantic, will be the only other Pacific Mail vessel in the Oriental service. Such are the plans of the Pacific Mail Steamship Company for conducting its share of the Oriental traffic when the Toyo Kisen Kaisha becomes a factor in the trade. This will all be in accordance with an agreement that has been effected between the new Japanese line and Pacific Mail and Occidental and Oriental Steamship companies.
