Mr. Carter presented the report of the Fifth delegation, the candidates receiving the largest number of votes were Messrs. Kaulukou, Wilder and McCandless.

The announcements were respectively greeted with applause, and on motion the nominations for both districts were unanimously ratified.

CENTRAL COMMITTEE.

Under the head of general business Mr. Towse suggested the Central Committee meet for organization at the close of the convention, but Mr. Low protested the hour was too late, it was time to go home.

At 12:05 a. m. the convention adjourned without day.

The Marking of Linen.

The marking of linen is quite a business in these days of sumptuous trousseaux. The Philadelphia Times tells how, in places which make a specialty of fine nary, orders are taken for the working of letters when the linen is selected, so that it can be sent home in boxes ready for use. One fancier will choose two unpretentious initials placed side by side and worked in plain raised satin stitch. Another chooses larger letters, to be intricately interlaced and elaborately worked with solid and open lace stitches. Huge ornamental monograms are also conspicuous on nary and bed linen as well as on towels. Three letters are a good rule in case of house linen, one for the respective initials of the Christian names of the bride and groom and the third for the family name.

Apple Pudding.

The following recipe is from The Household News:
Beat 2 eggs without separating until light. Add a cup of milk, 1 1/2 cups of pastry flour, beat until perfectly smooth. Add 2 tablespoonsful of melted butter, a half teaspoonful of salt and a heaped teaspoonful of baking powder. Pour this into a greased shallow baking pan. Have ready 6 apples, pared, cored and cut into quarters. Sink the quarters down, round side up, into this batter. Sprinkle over 4 tablespoonsful of granulated sugar and bake in a quick oven until the apples are soft about 30 minutes. Serve hot, cut into squares. Plain cream or hard sauce may be served with it.

Eggs Swiss Fashion.

A breakfast dish popular in some sections is Swiss eggs. Line a deep plate with thin slices of cheese. Mix one cup of milk and one teaspoonful of mustard and a dust of red pepper. Pour half of this mixture over the cheese, break in as many eggs as are needed, pour the remaining mixture over them and bake ten minutes.

One Way to Fry Bread.

Cut some bread, which, though stale, is still light and soft, into fingers half an inch thick, dip them in milk and let them drain for awhile. Brush them over with white of egg, dredge a little flour over them and fry them in a little hot butter in a frying pan. Pile them, pyramid fashion, in a hot dish and serve with gravy.
