MEMORIOS VOLUNTEER FIREMEN.

An Old Flagpole Ornament - Pole Standing a Quarter Century.

Hanging up in rear of an engine room in the Bell Tower is an effigy, in heavy plate copper, of a fireman blowing a trumpet. As it is stamped, "J. Nott, 1872," as the maker's mark, that gentleman was asked about it on Tuesday. Mr. Nott, it may be said, was chief engineer of the volunteer fire department eleven years ago, and had been in the brigade as foreman and member many years previously.

The veteran replied that the object in question was made to adorn the flagpole at No. 2 engine company's house door at the Bell Tower. It performed that service for some years, when the balliards got tangled about it, and the toy was brought down.

That flagpole was imported in the old Sound lumber trader, still unning to Honolulu until quite recently, the barkentine Jane A. Falkenburg. This was in 1872 and the pole was drawn from the splanade on Jerome Feary's trucks by the firemen. There was a terrible time getting the stick round the corners, as it was about 136 feet long before being planted. If it had not been for a vacant lot where the Hotel Stables are now, it would have been a miraculous feat to get the pole to its place at all. It was embedded in \$65 worth of cement and has stood firm these twenty-five years. On the day the pole was landed Mr. Nott's son Willie was born. This interesting event fixes the date in the former chief's mind. It was March 19, 1892, and the raising took place two weeks later.

Of course there was a big firemen's banquet in honor of the pole-raising. Mr. Nott says if it had not been that different persons contributed paint, gilding, labor, etc., for nothing the pole would have cost \$300 planted. Mr. Osborne, who built the post-office, did the concrete work as his contribution.

When the Bell Tower comes shortly to be vacated by the now paid department, the veteran firemen might be dispised to buy the old flagpole, and have its timber cut up for making souvenir articles from.

Mr. Nott has in his shop a weather vane in the form of an engine being driven to a fire, which he made as a present to No. 1 engine company in 1885 as his stamp on it indicates. It is of heavy plate copper reinforced with straps of flattened piping. After the disbandment in 1893, when No. 1's tall flagpole was sold, Chief Engineer Hunt did not consider this ornament belonged to the Government to sell, and Mr. Nott was therefore allowed to take it back.
