

ITEMS FROM HARBOR FRONT

Ship W. F. Babcock with Sugar Cargo for New York Refinery.

Liner Aorangi from Sydney to Victoria—Keahou from Hanamaulu—Noeau and Waialeale in Port with Sugar.

The ship S. P. Hitchcock took the steamer Keahou's sugar today.

The barkentine Archer is discharging 1000 tons of general merchandise at Pacific Mail wharf.

The steamer Helene sails Monday afternoon for Paahau, Kukaian, Lapaohohou, Honou, Hakalau, Honobina and Pohaku manua.

Port Surveyor Stratmeyer crosses the line again tomorrow, for the 45th anniversary of his birth occurs then. "J-rsey" is the recipient of many congratulations along shore.

The bark Andrew Welch's cargo for the San Francisco refinery consisted of 1639½ tons of sugar, valued at 112,470 and shipped by F A S haeter & Co, Castle & Cooke, H Waterhouse & Co and C Brewer & Co.

The ship W. F. Babcock cleared at the Custom house this morning with a full cargo of sugar for New York, 56,150 bags, 6,801,462 pounds, valued at \$248,287 and shipped by Castle & Cooke, C. Brewer & Co, H Hackfeld & Co, M. S. Gristbaum & Co, and Wm. G. Irwin & Co. (Makaweli).

Garden Isle Shipping.

The steamer Keahou with a load of Hanamaulu sugar for H. Hackfeld & Co arrived in port at 4 o'clock this morning. Captain Thompson still has the Katihiwai freight on board, it being impossible to land anything there on account of the heavy surf. Fresh winds from the north with heavy rain squalls have prevailed on the windward Kauai coast the past week. The steamer W. G. Hall will have about 6000 bags of sugar from leeward Kauai ports tomorrow. There is considerable rain all over the island. Sugar on Kauai: Kilaua 5500 b-g, Kapaa 5000 bags, Hanamaulu 2500 bags, Eleele 2000 bags, Makaweli 2500 bags, Kekaha 2500 bags.

MEMORANDA.

Per stmr Aorangi from Sydney: Left Sydney on the afternoon of Sunday the 6th inst at 6:30 p m. A moderate to fresh S E gale was experienced until noon on the 7th inst when the wind veered on the westward and then fine weather prevailed to Wellington which was reached on 11th inst, at 11 p m. Left again the following day and a continuance of fine weather was experienced to Sava which was arrived at on the morning of 17th inst. Left against at 6 p m and cleared the Fiji group the following day. The equator was crossed on Sunday, 20th inst, at 10 p m in long. 171 E after which heavy rains were experienced.
