rifles, and at the time the Japanese
 cruiser left Aguineldo was
 expected to make an immediate
 attack.

The Archbishop of Manila, an-
 nouncing in a pastoral that four
 Spanish warships were coming,
 promised victory for the Spaniards.

German Consul Threatens Dewey.

New York, May 24—A dis-
 patch from Manila says that
 Dewey has been threatened by
 the German Consul there. The
 Consul, after an interview with
 the Spanish Governor General,
 tried to laud provisions
 from a German
 ship, but Dewey refused permis-
 sion. The Consul then declared
 that he would force the landing
 with the aid of the two German
 cruisers in Manila Bay. There-
 upon Dewey said he would fire on
 the cruisers if they interfered.
 The provisions were not landed.

Opposition to Annexation.

New York, May 24.—The
 Herald's Washington correspon-
 dent says: When the Hawaiian
 annexation matter comes up in
 the Senate it will be fought with
 great determination by Sena-
 tor White and other op-
 ponents of annexation. Sena-
 tor White has given notice
 that a campaign of delay will be
 entered upon, which will indefi-
 nitely postpone the adjournment
 of Congress and will retard all leg-
 islation, no matter how pressing
 in importance.

Representative Tawney of Min-
 nesota presented Captain Hatch
 of Minnesota to the President to-
 day. Mr. Tawney, in discussing
 the Hawaiian annexation issue,
 gave his personal opinion that the
 report of the Foreign Affairs Com-
 mittee on the Newlands resolu-
 tion would be taken up in the
 House of Representatives the
 latter part of this week and time
 for debate would be allowed. He
 has made a personal canvass of
 the Republican side of the House
 and found 189 Republicans ready
 to vote for annexation. About two-
 thirds of them, he said, favored
 immediate consideration.

Contrary to a published report,
 Mr. Tawney has not represented
 to Speaker Reed the sentiment of
 the House in favor of annexation,
 but he believes a prompt consid-
 eration of the resolution will be
 allowed.




