



IN PROBATE—AT CHAMBERS.

In the matter of the Estate of Louis Richards Rosa, minor. Before Judge A. Perry. Order to show cause on application of Guardian to sell Ward's Real Estate. On reading and filing the Petition of Joseph Rosa, the Guardian of Louis Richards Rosa, minor, praying for an order of sale of certain real estate belonging to his said ward, being an undivided one-third (1/3) interests in and to sixty-one-thousands (61/1000) of an acre of land comprised in Royal Patent 2913, Kaleana 9003, to Kahoomana, Kikihale, described as commencing at the South Angle at fence corner joining land of Hoollilimano and the West Angle of Opanui's lot, thence running North 75° East Magnetic 63.41 feet; thence North 22° 1/4 West Magnetic 50.5 feet along division line; thence South 55° West Magnetic 25.1 feet; thence South 50° West Magnetic 48.2 feet; thence South 43° 45 East Magnetic 29.7 feet to place of beginning and meaning and including all of said minor's interest in and to the land conveyed in said Royal Patent 2913.
