

ITEMS FROM HARBOR FRONT

The Colusa has hauled alongside the old fishmarket wharf. The transport ship Tacoma has hauled over to the Irmgard wharf. The Vincent has hauled over to the Fort street wharf to discharge her cargo of coal. The Kauai will make a special trip to Kauai ports with coal and lumber tomorrow afternoon. The Waialeale came up from Kahuku, this Island in 4 hours and 37 minutes and not 8 hours as stated in the morning paper. The two new boilers for the Electric Light Works were discharged from the W H Dimond at Allen & Robinson's wharf this forenoon. The James Makee came in from Kapaa this morning with the small cargo of 150 bags of rice. She will sail again this afternoon, taking a load of coal. The schooner Lady arrived in port last evening with 600 bags of rice which she is discharging on the Oceanic wharf. She will sail again this afternoon. The American schooner Esther Bubne, Anderson master, arrived in port early last evening, 18 days from Eureka with a cargo of 339,000 feet of lumber for the O L & B Co of this city. Captain Johnson of the S C Allen was entertained at dinner at Arlington hotel last evening by passengers who came down with him from San Francisco. Purser Christian of the Waialeale reports as follows on matters on the windward side of this island: Fine weather at Oahu ports. There are 200 bags of rice left at Punaluu. A new 12-inch well being sunk at the Moruan settlement in Laie.
