THE FIRE IN KENILWORTH

An Example of Maritime Delays in South America.

Renewal of Combustion in Port—Officials Terrified at Floating Volcano—High Priced Fire Tugs.

Mr. Thrum, in writing to his parents from Valparaiso, tells of the boarding of the ship Kenilworth by officials there, and the offer of a powerful steam fire tug to fill the ship with water, which, however, was not deemed necessary. They went ashore the day of arrival with the captain of the port, Captain Campbell, and met the American consul and Mr. Shipley, vice consul, representing W. R. Grace & Co. of New York. There was to be a court of inquiry the next day, and full instructions were expected from the agents.

TWENTY DAYS LATER.
VALPARAISO, July 23.—Twenty days and nothing done about ascertaining the cause of the fire or extent of damage, by the authorities, insurance agents or owners. Samples of gas have been taken from different parts of the ship. The other day the Rev. F. Thompson came aboard and we had a most pleasant chat. He inquired after Hilo people particularly, having been located there at one time.

STILL LATER.
VALPARAISO, Aug. 5.—Undoubtedly the whole cargo will have to be taken out. The vessel is undergoing extensive repairs, necessitating her being here for two or three months. Investigations began to take a definite shape last Sunday morning after delays caused by the insurance agents, sugar chemists probing for gas and heat, etc.

After an examination lasting all Friday morning without taking the hatches off, the chemists appointed by the insurance people came to the conclusion that a fire was out, reporting to the agents in writing that they could go ahead and take out the cargo to find the extent of the damage. At 2:30 p. m. that day the board of surveyors appointed by the consul of the United States, at the captain's request, ordered the hatches off. After half an hour smoke began increasing and the hatches were immediately ordered on, we all going ashore thinking little of what we had seen. After we had been in the consul's office but a short time the telephone rang, informing us that the

almost redhot and smoking to beat the band. The captain of the port had been on board with one of the clerks from the agents' office, and they were properly frightened, wanting to know "if everything was going to hell."

Mr. Thrum here tells of ventilators and hatches being again closed, the conditions being the same as they were at sea. Saturday morning it was found necessary to employ a steam fire tug, as the side of the ship was so hot one could not touch it without getting burnt. The first tug charged \$50 an hour, but another was hired at \$150 a day.

The rest of the story, including the sailing of the Kenilworth, was told in yesterday's paper.
