The Zealandia's Damage. The Zealandia was damaged to a greater extent in the typhoon she encountered after leaving Manila than was at first known.

Boats were crushed by the waves and carried out of their davits; ventilators were torn from their fastenings and sent scurrying along the sea; rails were smashed and everything moveable on deck was adrift. Mountains of water came tumbling down on the houses and decks with the force of an avalanche. The deckhouses were smashed in and portions of them carried away. Even the anchors were wrenched loose and were awash on deck. The big hooks were secured with the greatest difficulty. Five men in the fire room were scalded by escaping steam and it was impossible for any one to keep a footing without holding on. One of the quartermasters had an arm broken and the butcher dislocated one of his shoulders.
