ARMY BILL MAY PASS.

New York, February 23.—A special to the Sun from Wash-
ington says: Today's developments
indicate pretty clearly that it will
not be necessary for President
McKinley to call for an extra ses-
sion of the Fifty-sixth Congress
for the purpose of passing the
army reorganization bill.

In other words the basis of a
compromise was arranged, the re-
sult of which will be the tempo-
rary reorganization of the army to
continue until 1901 by which time
Congress will have had time fully
to consider the permanent needs
of the service.

The Cockerill bill will be used
as the skeleton of the compromise
bill, all after the enacting clause
being stricken out and new pro-
visions inserted. In a general
way they will provide for the con-
tinuation until 1901 of the present
strength of the regular army,
62,000 men, with the addition of
thirty five volunteer regiments to
be enlisted for service in Cuba,
Porto Rico and the Philippines,
they to be made up of natives or
not, as the President may deter-
mine, and their officers also to be
selected by him. The staff de-
partments are to be increased,
probably on the present basis of
the volunteer army, and provision
may also be made for the appoint-
ment of additional Brigadier-
Generals.

NO DEMANDS FOR REMOVAL.

So Far the Powers have Confined
Themselves to Suggestions.

Washington, February 23.—No
demand has been made by the
German Government for the re-
moval by the United States of
Chief Justice Chambers of Samoa,
nor is it true that either the United
States or the British Govern-
ment has demanded the relief of
the president of the Municipal
Council, Dr. Raffel, and the Ger-
man Consul at Apia, Mr. Rosa.

The acts of these officials have
been the object of criticism, and it
has gone to the point that a sug-
gestion has been made from each
of the two sides into which the
issue has divided the tripartite
powers that the most satisfactory
and quickest way to restore har-
monious relations and insure a
peaceable administration in Sa-
moa would be to withdraw all of
these officials and to wipe out all
old scores.

At the same time there have
been no demands made on either
side—nothing but intimations and
suggestions. What the result will
be it is not possible to foretell.
By this time, if the German prom-
ise has been carried out, one of
these factors has been removed in
the person of Dr. Raffel, who has
been recalled to Germany.

Record Sugar Yield.

A plot of 106 acres of sugar
cane on the Ewa plantation yield-
ed for the present season's crop
an average of twelve tons of sugar
to the acre. It was first ratooned
at that, or the second growth of
cane from one planting. This
yield undoubtedly makes the
record for the world.

Appeal to Supreme Court.

Judge Perry has denied the
motion of plaintiff for a trial, in
the case of L. L. McCandless vs.
S. Mahelona and others. C. B.
Brown for plaintiff; J. M. Poepoe
and A. A. Wilder for defendants.
The plaintiff appeals to the Su-
preme Court. Each party is to
pay his own costs. It will be re-
membered the verdict gave Mc-
candless half and Mahelona the
other half of the property in dis-
pute.
