Nuuanu Forest. David Haughs of the Government Nursery and Allen Herbert were up on a tour of inspection of the Nuuanu valley forests yesterday afternoon, this with a view of laying out an avenue of trees near the Fall road.

The plan is to have as many indigenous trees as possible planted on the upper part of the road. A row will be planted on each side of the road and ten feet out from each will be planted another row. It is proposed that between these rows in the avenue to plant shrubbery such as the crocus and others. The new road is progressing nicely but Mr. Herbert thinks that the contractor took the job at too small a figure and is afraid that he will be unable to finish it at the price named.
