H. Hackfeld & Co. have consigned to them 1800 tons of merchandise on board the bark Hackfeld which arrived yesterday from Liverpool.

The bktnr Planter was outside the harbor last night at a late hour, and was towed into port this morning early, making fast to the Pacific Mail wharf. She left San Francisco on Friday the 19th ult., making the trip here in 15 days, enjoying a light fair wind nearly all the way. The Planter has a general cargo aboard consigned to H. Hackfeld & Co. Besides which she has on her decks a large smoke stack for the Oahu Plantation and 195 hogs for a local firm. Messrs. Hill, Jackson and Ingersoll are passengers. This is Captain McNeill's first voyage with the Planter. He was formerly commander of the S. G. Wilder, being many years on that boat. He is well known in Honolulu, and his boat of friends are always glad to hear of his being in port. The Planter will carry sugar from here to San Francisco.

"It looks to me as if there will be a development in the stroke of the Myrtles this year. There is, however, no better stroke than Sorenson in his own style. I believe that the rowing of Lansdale will have an influence on the stroke of the Myrtle boys. His is the stroke of the big American colleges which commences from a long reach forward. The slide is used much sooner than in their older styles of strokes once in vogue here. The idea is that the greater power can be obtained from the leg muscles, the strongest in a man's body."

BY AUTHORITY. By the President of the United States. EXECUTIVE ORDER. In the exercise of the power conferred upon him by the Joint Resolution of Congress, approved by the President on July 7th, 1898, entitled "Joint Resolution to provide for Annexing the Hawaiian Islands to the United States," the President of the United States hereby directs that the General Election provided for by the Constitution of the Republic of Hawaii to be held on the last Wednesday in September next, shall not be held. All elective officers whose terms of office shall expire before appropriate legislation shall have been enacted by the Congress of the United States shall be continued in their office at the pleasure of the President of the United States. In Witness Whereof, I have caused (SEAL) the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed. Washington, May 13, 1899. (Signed), WILLIAM MCKINLEY.
