NEWS OF CAMP MCKINLEY

Private Frederick Bryan, Battery N, will be discharged in a few days, having completed three years' service with Uncle Sam. He does not contemplate enlisting again but expects to return to the States and take advantage of a lucrative position offered him on the Baltimore and Ohio railroad.

The following promotions have taken place in Battery A: Corporal Miller, appointed sergeant, vice Walton transferred; Lance corporal John W. Maddra made corporal in place of Miller promoted; Private Short, Callinger and Wheeler, made corporals to fill original vacancies. Private McEndree appointed lance corporal, vice Maddra promoted.

The 6th U. S. Infantry that passed through Honolulu a few days ago en route to Manila, on the U. S. Army transport Sherman, was one of the regiments of regulars that suffered so much loss in killed and wounded at the battle of Santiago and the famous charge up San Juan hill, in Cuba. Out of 480 men taken over to Cuba, there only returned to the United States a fraction over one-third of that number, 183.

In addition to the regular ration issued to enlisted men there has been allowed two ounces of dried fruit to the ration or twelve pounds and eight ounces to a hundred rations. Dried, pickled, and fresh fish has also been added in lieu of the ordinary beef ration when desired.

There are fifty one enlisted men in the United States army at the present time that have served continuously for thirty years, and four others that have served continuously for thirty five years. The Reverend Leslie Morgan, assisted by a few members of his congregation, gave an entertainment in the church near Kaplan Park, last Thursday night to the soldier boys of Camp McKinley. Sergeant Major Wilson assisted in the work by reciting a short story that caused much amusement. After the lecture refreshments were served in the shape of lemonade and cake, which was the most enjoyable part of the entertainment to the soldiers. It has been decided to hold meetings every Thursday night, provided the use of this church can be obtained.

The adjourned annual meeting of the Hawaiian Mission Children's Society took place in the parlors of Central Union Church Saturday evening. The time was devoted to the reading of the annual reports of the society. Treasurer L. A. Dickey reported \$559 left in the treasury after an expenditure of \$2623. Rev. O. H. Gulick as recording secretary and Miss M. A. Chamberlain as corresponding secretary read their respective reports. Rev. J. Leaning addressed the meeting on the subject, "Industrial Experiments in Hawaii and Their Influence." Girls from the Portuguese Mission and Kawaiaho Seminary as well as the pupils of the Chinese Mission, furnished musical selections. The meeting was a very enthusiastic one throughout. The society is in the very best of circumstances.
