**A HERO OF THE CIVIL WAR**  
Death of Capt. Julian Myers of the Confederate Navy.  
New York, May 26.—Capt. Julian Myers, formerly of the Confederate navy, died at Mont Clair, N. J., last night, aged 74 years.

He was born in Savannah, Ga., and at the age of 13 enlisted in the United States navy, where he served with honor and distinction. He was twice promoted by special act of Congress for bravery.

When the civil war broke out Capt. Myers resigned his commission and started at once for the South, where he joined the Confederate navy. He was at once placed in command of the "Huntsville" and took part in every naval engagement with Admiral Farragut's fleet below Mobile.

Capt. Myers to escape being captured by the Union ships, was obliged to scuttle his ship.

After the civil war Capt. Myers refused to be reconstructed and would not take the oath of allegiance to the United States. The remains will be taken to Savannah tomorrow for burial. Two daughter survive their father.

Captain Julian Myers was a brother of Dr. R. P. Myers of this city. With Dr. Myers there are now five brothers left; Henry who was first in the U. S. Navy and afterward paymaster on the Sumpter; Frederick, living in Savannah; Octavius Myers of New York and Frank Meyers of Atlanta.
