


LUNA JACOBSON HURT.

Word comes from the other side of this island that Mr. Jacobson, head luna of the Heeia plantation, met with a somewhat serious accident last Saturday evening, while on his way home on horseback from Honolulu. On the new Pali road on this side of the mountain workmen have piled ragged-edged lava rock to be used as surface dressing on the road; but, it is said, no lantern is displayed to warn travelers of the obstruction in the road. Mr. Jacobson's horse got frightened at some embers of a fire at one side of the road, and made a lunge into the pile of sharp rock that was unobserved by the rider in the darkness. One of the man's hands was badly cut and the horse was so seriously cut on the legs and one shoulder that it will be weeks before it can be used again. Mr. Jacobson found it necessary to bind one of the horse's wounds with his handkerchief, to keep the animal from bleeding to death, and so weak did the animal become that it had to be led instead of ridden home, arriving at Heeia at 2 o'clock Sunday morning. At the time of the accident Mr. Jacobson lost part of a new suit of clothes he was carrying in a bundle, and at the Pali his hat was carried away by the wind.
