Judge Kalua's Narrow Escape. Wailuku, Nov. 4.—Judge Kalua came very near losing his life last Tuesday afternoon while crossing the first crossing, Lao stream, on horseback. His horse had gone as far as the middle of the stream and then stopped to drink. In a very few minutes, the water of the stream rose very rapidly and the horse was thrown off its feet. Mr. Kalua fell off and was washed down by the freshet for a distance of over two hundred yards. By almost superhuman efforts he reached the other side of the stream with a few scratches. The horse after struggling with the elements for a while also reached the shore in safety.
