Walluku, Oct. 20.—There were heavy rains throughout the greater part of Maui, excepting Makawao, last Tuesday. Quite a heavy freshet flowed down Honouliua valley but no damage was done to either life or property. At Kula, the freshet did considerable damage to growing crops of corn and potatoes.

A heavy freshet also washed down Waikapu road that night and only one back from Walluku passed on the other side to go to Maunaea bay to bring back Mauna Loa passengers. Thunder and very vivid lightning played in the western heavens during the earlier part of the evening. Not much rain, however, fell during the night, and no very considerable damage is reported from the outside districts.
