DELEGATE WILCOX'S VIEWS ON HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE Work of Jared Smith and Fish Commission--Attitude of Russia Regarding the Sugar Duty and Retaliation.

[Special Correspondence.] Washington, D. C., March 20.—Jared G. Smith of the Department of Agriculture has left Washington for Hawaii.

Delegate Wilcox of Hawaii is an earnest advocate of the teaching of the Hawaiian language in the schools of the Territory.

The United States Fish Commission is soon to undertake an investigation of the fishes in the Hawaiian Islands.

The new Russian tariff schedule against American products including sugar has gone into operation.

The leading financial paper of St. Petersburg, which has an official status, has a long article which appears to set forth the government view concerning the American imposition of a tax on Russian sugar.

In this view the statement holds that if the Russian allowance on sugar is construed to be a bounty, then all articles paying a revenue tax in the United States must similarly be construed as receiving bounties when they are relieved of this revenue tax on being exported.

The death of Caesar Celso Moreno attracted much attention here and the local papers published long stories of his varied and romantic career.
