

Last night only three of the twelve vessels in port were at the city wharves. All the others were paying wharfage to the railroad or navy department. 

AMERICAN TONNAGE.

The aggregate tonnage of American vessels, says the U. S. Commissioner of Navigation, is 5,164,839 tons, with 1,565,587 tons of this on the Great Lakes or 30 per cent. In 1891 our aggregate tonnage was 4,684,759 tons, with 24 per cent of this on the Lakes. Of the iron and steel tonnage in the United States, 687,769 tons, or 43 per cent, are represented by vessels on the Great Lakes, though, out of the 1225 iron and steel vessels flying the American flag, only 322 are on the Great Lakes, with 763 on the Atlantic and Gulf coasts. Last year the aggregate Lake tonnage up to the close of the fiscal year, June 30, 1900, was 1,565,587 tons.—Engineering News.
