PROPOSED PARTY GOVERNMENT RULES TO BE ACTED UPON AT SATURDAY'S COMMITTEE MEETING (Continued.)

purpose of nominating a candidate for Delegate shall be held during the first week in September immediately preceding the general elections. The day of convening and the place of holding such conventions shall be determined by the Territorial Central Committee, or its Executive Committee.
Sec. 3. The Territorial Convention for the purpose of choosing delegates to the Republican National Convention shall be held at least sixty days prior to the date fixed for holding such National Convention. The date of holding such Territorial Convention and the place of holding the same shall be determined by the Territorial Central Committee, or its Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Section 1. Each executive committee may appoint an advisory committee to consist of such a number and to serve for such a time as it deems best, whose duty it shall be to advise with and aid said executive committee in the conduct of party affairs in such manner as such executive committee shall provide.
Sec. 2. Each executive committee shall appoint the following standing committees to consist of such a number as the committee may direct:
(1) A committee on law to represent the committee in all legal matters;
(2) A committee on public meetings to arrange for all campaign meetings and provide speakers and music for the same;
(3) A committee on naturalization to have charge of all naturalization matters;
(4) A committee on registration to get voters to register;
(5) A committee on voting to keep informed of the number and feelings of the Republican voters in each precinct during each campaign and to get them to the polls;
(6) A committee on public improvements to aid in securing improvements for the precinct, district or Territory; and
(7) A committee on finance to provide funds.
Sec. 3. The following shall be the order of business at all meetings held under these rules and regulations:
(1) Roll call.
(2) Reading of minutes.
(3) Reports of officers.
(4) Reports of standing committees.
(5) Reports of special committees.
(6) Communications.
(7) Unfinished business.
(8) New business.
(9) Miscellaneous business.
(10) Adjournment.
Sec. 4. No member shall speak longer than five minutes on more than twice on any subject except by a two-thirds vote of the body or in addressing.
Sec. 5. Motions shall not be put or debated until seconded and when seconded shall be stated by the presiding officer before debate.
Sec. 6. All resolutions shall be reduced to writing and signed by the member offering the same, upon the request of the presiding officer or any member.
Sec. 7. On any question, the yeas and nays may be taken, if requested by one-fifth of the members present and entered in full on the minutes.
Sec. 8. When the question has been stated, the following motions and no other shall be entertained: To amend, to amend the amendment, to substitute, to lay on the table, to refer to a committee, to take the previous question, and to adjourn. A motion to adjourn or lay on the table shall be in order at any time, but such motions may not be renewed until there has been intervening business and shall be decided without debate.
Sec. 9. A motion to reconsider business once disposed of shall not be entertained, unless moved by a member voting with the majority, nor unless moved at the same or next meeting of the club or committee, as the case may be.
Sec. 10. In all cases not provided for in the foregoing, the rules as laid down in Cushing's Manual shall govern.
Sec. 11. Whenever officers are elected or delegates to district committees are chosen by any precinct club, the secretary thereof shall forward without delay to the Secretary of the Territorial Central Committee and to the recording secretary of the district committee, in whose district the precinct is located, full reports of such election.
Sec. 12. Each district committee, whenever it elects officers, chooses delegates to Territorial Conventions, or nominates candidates, and at each general election, shall make a report without delay to the Secretary of the Territorial Central Committee.
Sec. 13. An appeal may be taken from any action of a precinct club, or its executive committee, to the district committee, and from any action of a district committee or its executive committee to the Executive Committee of the Territorial Central Committee, and from its decision an appeal may be taken to the Territorial Central Committee. In the event of an appeal, the records of such appeal, or a certified copy thereof, shall be taken to the appellate body, by the presiding secretary.
ARTICLE VII.—AMENDMENTS.
Section 1. These Rules and Regulations may be amended at any regular meeting of the Territorial Central Committee by a majority vote of the members present, provided the proposed amendment shall have the approval of two-thirds of the members of the Executive Committee thereof, who make it, and receive a two-thirds vote of all the members of the Committee.
