WAIHAWA CELEBRATION

Justifications are not confined to the settled population centers of Hawaii. Previous mention has been made in the Bulletin of D. W. Shelbamer being employed by the Waihawa Agricultural Company to guard the headwaters of the streams supplying its thrifty cane fields. He is located far up in the mountains, but is provided with comfortable quarters by the company. Members of his family have been with him part of the time for company. Miss Faith Shelbamer was "sweet sixteen" May 21st and the event was celebrated the following Sunday. Mr. Shelbamer writes about the affair as follows:

"It was a success, and a jolly crowd never gathered at a camp. The following were present: Miss Bevans, school teacher of Waihawa; Miss Bullock of Lei Lehua ranch; Miss Holden and Miss Fannie Shelbamer of Waihawa; and Messrs. Porter, Wilson (dam contractor), Dean, Orme and Carver of Waihawa. The invitations were pieces of sandalwood cut in the shape of a piece of pie, inscribed. The bill of fare was chicken pie, pork and beans, lemon pie, cake and coffee, candy and cigars. The table, instead of a cloth was covered with ferns two inches thick and dotted all over with red balsam flowers. Japanese napkins in bamboo holders. The effect was very pretty. The walls and ceiling of the dining room were covered with elegant ferns.

"I have fitted up a park near the camp with swing, hammocks, rustic seats both on the ground and in trees; also a plank over a limb for a seesaw, which seemed to be a great attraction. But the most fun for the young folks was riding a toboggan down a steep hill. It brought back boyhood days to me, but I don't think I ever enjoyed coasting on the snow any more than the young folks did sliding down over the slippery grass. And then the jolly center of nine miles on good horses must have been a pleasure to them also.

SEARCHING FOR THE REMAINS OF PRENTIS

New York, May 17.—A cable to the Sun from St. Lucia says: Captain McLean and Commander Gilmore of the cruiser Cincinnati, and Consul Aymo, with a guide, went Friday to St. Pierre, Martinique, to search for the body of Mr. Prentis, the American Consul; also for the bodies of the members of his family.

The guide located the American Consulate in a mass of stones. He penetrated the ruins and found much silver ware marked "M." A skeleton was found in the courtyard, but there was nothing to show its identity. Several tons of stones must be removed before positive identification can be made. The mark "M" on the silver ware probably represents the name of Consul Prentis' wife. The investigation of the ruins and search for the bodies will be continued.

Movement of Transports.

San Francisco, May 18.—The transport Kilpatrick arrived at Manila May 11th, and the Sherman May 12th. The Meade sailed from Nagasaki May 13th. The Warren sailed from Manila May 14th for San Francisco with Company I, Ninth Infantry; sixty-five casualties and 300 marines. These are the troops that took part in the invasion of China and were in the battle of Tientsin. The Buford is the next transport to sail from this port for the Philippines. She will leave here on June 2a via Honolulu and Guam. She has capacity for 924 passengers, but the troops to go on her have not been as yet assigned.

Fears for H. F. Glade.

San Francisco, May 18.—News of the arrival of the American ship Dirigo at Honolulu was brought by the Coptic last night. Fifteen per cent reinsurance was being paid on the Dirigo. The fears of the underwriters for the safety of the German ship H. F. Glade have increased. Today the rates on her rose from 80 to 85 per cent. The vessel is now 299 days out from this port for the United Kingdom.

Sailing of the Korea.

It is expected that the new Pacific Mail steamship Korea will sail from San Francisco on the Orient run on August 1st.

D. 1902, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, provided the same shall be a day of jurisdiction; otherwise on the next day of jurisdiction thereafter, then and there to interpose their claims and to make their allegations in that behalf.
