





MORE RAW SUGAR DUTY

Senator Dietrich offers compromise measure. Conferences on Cuban tariff fail to produce an agreement—Big War Claims of Cuban Planters.

Washington, June 5.—Senator Bard said today he was reliably informed that the President and the reciprocity advocates in the Senate had shown signs of weakening, and that the prospects of the rebate plan were more flattering than at any time heretofore.

Washington, June 3.—Senator Dietrich of Nebraska, who stands with the beet sugar interests in opposition to the reduction of the duty on Cuban sugars, as proposed by the Republican members of the Senate Committee on Cuban Relations, today introduced a bill on the subject, which he thinks will be accepted as a compromise measure.

Kempff is Praised By the President

Washington, June 5.—Rear Admiral Kempff was presented to the President today by Representative Bartholdt. The President took occasion to praise the admiral for his action in refusing to join in the bombardment of the Taku forts soon after the legation relief expedition arrived in Chinese waters.
