## SHIP CHAPMAN IS VERY SPEEDY BOAT

The American ship I. F. Chapman, which arrived in port from New York a few days ago after an unusually fast passage, can boast of more than one fine performance in the matter of fast passages. Her most famous piece of work is probably the trip made in 1909, when she sailed with the ships Henry B. Hyde and A. G. Ropes. The details of this interesting race were as follows:

The famous American clipper ship Henry B. Hyde, Captain McClellan, sailed from this port on July 3, 1909, for New York with a full load of sugar. Her owners made a bet of \$500 that that she would make the run in 100 days. She arrived at New York November 13, thus making the run in 103 days.

The American ship I. F. Chapman, which sailed from Honolulu July 19, 1909, arrived in New York November 12, or one day before the Hyde, making the run in 116 days, and beating the Hyde seventeen days on the voyage.

The American clipper ship A. G. Ropes, Captain Chapman, sailed from Honolulu on July 14, 1909, and arrived in New York November 16. She made the run in 125 days, beating the Hyde eight days and being beaten by the Chapman by nine days.

The best run ever made by a sailing vessel from Honolulu to New York was made by the famous American clipper ship Sovereign of the Seas, Captain L. McKay. She left this port March 12, 1853, with a load of whale oil and made the run in eighty-two days, a passage never since equalled.

### GERTRUD AND GERDA.

The two German vessels which arrived just after each other from Germany, namely the Gertrud, which arrived Saturday after a 119-day passage, and the Gerda, which arrived yesterday after a voyage of 152 days, had bad weather round the Horn. The Gertrud struck eight days of very bad weather, during which her fore lower topsail yard fell down on deck; while the Gerda struck a heavy gale accompanied by tremendous waves which kept all hands busy for the time being. The Gerda brings 1,920 tons of general merchandise consigned to H. Hackfeld & Co. She is lying at the Irmgard wharf.

## INFORMATION BUREAU

The Merchants' Association has not taken any action yet with reference to the information bureau project which was reported on by a committee at the last meeting of the body. The report at that time was ordered printed and, on inquiry today, it was found that the pamphlets would not be out until tomorrow and, since Wednesday is no action taken until Thursday. Speaking of the information bureau matter this morning, one of the most prominent of the members of the Merchants' Association said: "The Merchants' Association will undoubtedly act favorably on the suggestion of the committee. It is probable that then another committee will be sent to such houses as Irwin & Co. and Hackfeld & Co. and ask them to start subscriptions toward the establishment of the Coast of a bureau of information. These houses and others of a like nature are more deeply concerned than any of the rest, and if they agree to subscribe, the merchants will surely come in to swell the fund."

"It seems to me that if a suitable man could be established in San Francisco at a stated salary and guaranteed a thousand dollars a month, the object would be felt here and the money would give magnificent returns."
