

**ROUGH ON HAWAII**

The steamer Mauna Loa arrived from Kau, Kona and Maui ports this morning at 6:29 o'clock with 7831 bags sugar, 391 bags coffee, 356 bags taro, 14 bags coconuts, 163 bunches bananas, 53 cases dried fish, 34 kegs butter, 25 cases fruit, 5 bundles hides, 79 packages, 1 cow, 1 calf, 30 head cattle and 142 packages sundries.

The following sugar is reported at Hawaii ports ready for shipment: H. A. Co., 2566 bags; H. S. P. S. M., no communication; H. S. Co., 2560, and K. S. Co., none.

Purser Simerson reports as follows: Very rough seas and blowing a N.E. gale along the Hamakua coast. Lots of rain. The steamer Noeua is weathered at Waipio. Heavy N.E. squalls and winds along the Kau coast throughout the trip. Little rain. The steamer Kauai was at Punaluu. She was not able to work on account of rough seas and strong winds. Blew a gale of N.N.E. and rough seas across the channels coming home.
