THE PAUOA WATER QUESTION (Continued from Page 3.) paying it to the counties there will not be more than \$629,000 left in the treasury. Take \$150,000 out of that for the Pauoa water and the treasury balance for all Territorial purposes will be reduced to \$479,000.

Mr. McCandless Talks. Senator McCandless said he was sorry he had not gone to Senator Isenberg with his objections. Senators Achi and himself were joshing him, when he told them no matter what they did the bill would be passed over their head.

Senator Isenberg's Speech. Senator Isenberg said: As chairman of that committee I feel the slurs the Governor has cast on that committee. He said that committee had neglected its duty I would take my medicine. The Governor says we acted in the interests of a private individual. That is not so. We had meetings to which the public was invited, but nobody came before that committee.

ats should stand together if for no other reason than to take off the slurs placed upon us by that man sitting in that chair over there. I shall never forget that the slur has been cast upon me.

The Financial Question. Senator Brown made a brief reply to the financial argument of Senator Baldwin. He said that the money was to be paid the counties the first part of January. They must remember that money would be coming in from licenses, etc., the whole of the year.

Senator Baldwin asked if it was not made obligatory by the provision to pay it out of the first receipts. Senator Brown in reply quoted the clause, "or otherwise acquire," and went on to say that the trouble was the Executive was bent upon building a reservoir in Nuuanu valley which would receive all the fowl wash of rotten vegetation and be a nursery of the germs of pestilence.

Senator Baldwin again reverted to the economical phase. It was well understood that the expenses would be greater under county government and they had not increased the taxes one iota. The counties had no power to increase taxes. The Territory had no such figure as \$150,000 to devote to the purchase of those springs.

Mr. Achi Speaks. Senator Achi said: I voted against this bill before and I feel the same way now. We have a right to condemn the water in Pauoa and the water in Kailu. In this bill we force the Government officers to buy this water and pay for it without estimating what it is worth, and I do not believe in taking it that way.

Senator Isenberg—Did you know that at the time we were holding meetings? Senator Achi—I did not know it then but after the veto I prepared myself. It was not my duty to make the investigation.

Senator Isenberg—Does the assessment fix the value? Senator Achi—it forms a basis of estimate. In answer to Messrs. Dickey and Isenberg, the speaker said the aggregate value of the lands owned by the Bishop Estate and others in Booth's vicinity was \$48,000. He concluded saying it was not right to take so much money for Oahu and he did not think the Senators from the other Islands would be doing their duty by their constituents in passing this bill.

Mr. McCandless Talks. Senator McCandless said he was sorry he had not gone to Senator Isenberg with his objections. Senators Achi and himself were joshing him, when he told them no matter what they did the bill would be passed over their head.

Senator Isenberg—I was joshing him then. Senator McCandless proceeded to say that he asked the committee to get certain information, figures from the Superintendent of Public Works. The speaker repeated his calculations given when the bill was before the Senate, to show that when the cost of development was added to purchase the interest on the aggregate would exceed the cost of the Beretania street pumping station by \$4,972.45 a year. He then produced figures from the tax office to prove an excessive valuation on the property.

Senator Dickey Explains. Senator Dickey said: I am a member of the committee and the one referred to by Senator Isenberg as having changed my mind. I believe the Government should own that water. It has been analyzed and found purer than any other water used in the city. One argument that has caused me to change my mind is the financial one of Senator Baldwin. I do not believe the Governor intended any insult. I believe the Governor acted according to his lights, but I believe the Governor is mistaken about that water. It is a mistake to say that it decreases at any time of the year. The water of the upper spring comes out with a force that shows a great reservoir behind it. Those taro patches have never gone dry. We had the evidence of natives living there for sixty years. People who state otherwise calculate on what they have observed in the bed of the stream below the taro patches. I do not believe that the Government will ever be able to buy that water at as low a figure as that placed in the bill. Yet to pay for it now would seriously cripple the Treasury.
