The steamer Mikahala arrived from Kauai ports yesterday at 4:05 a. m.

Purser Friel reports as follows: "The steamer Kauai was at Waimea discharging freight. The barkentine Puako was discharging coal at Makaweli. She had 650 tons out. The R. R. Hind had 700 tons of coal out. Strong trade-winds on Kauai crossing the channel, strong trade-winds and heavy seas.
