COPTIC FROM ORIENT. The Occidental & Oriental steamship Coptic arrived from the Orient this morning. She was docked at the Bishop wharf a little after 10 o'clock. The Coptic experienced an uneventful voyage. She made the run from Yokohama to this port in 9 days, 15 hours and 9 minutes. The officers of the steamship expected to get her into port last night, but heavy head winds during the last three days delayed the boat.

The Coptic has no passengers or lay-overs for this port. Among the passengers for San Francisco is Dr. J. K. Reader, who has been to Oaika as a commissioner to the fair at that place. He is accompanied by Mrs. Reader.

J. G. Jury is a San Francisco lawyer who returns from a trip to the Orient. With him are Mrs. Jury and Master Jury.

Captain J. Bugge, U. S. A., returns from service in the Philippines on General Davis' staff. He is going to West Point.

R. L. Fulton is a land agent of the Southern Pacific Railroad. L. Hopkins is a member of the staff of the Sydney Bulletin.

The Coptic brings 720 tons of freight for this port. She has a cargo of over 3,000 tons for San Francisco. She brings only 97 Japanese immigrants for Honolulu. Over 200 were rejected.

The Coptic is scheduled to sail for San Francisco this afternoon at 5 o'clock.
