There will be a full dress rehearsal of Said Pasha this evening at the Opera House. Captain Jorgetroff will play the title role in the absence of Raymond C. Brown. The price of seats has been reduced to \$1 in all parts of the house. Gallery seats are 25 cents.

At a meeting of the Y. M. C. A. Devotional Committee last evening, Messrs. Brown, Law and Snodgrass were appointed to conduct the Sunday afternoon services this year. The general religious work will be in charge of Messrs. Snodgrass, Higgins and Tranfaglia.

It is reported that W. M. Graham, who went to China some time ago to secure mining properties, has succeeded in securing an option on 30,000 square miles of Territory bordering on Thibet. The area reported is equivalent to half the area of the States of Minnesota or Iowa.

A small fire was discovered in the rear portion of Rosenberg's bottle house on Queen street last night at 10:45 o'clock. The chemical engine extinguished the blaze before any damage was done. A bottle containing kerosene and some sacks were found underneath the floor where a hole had been burned through it. No insurance is carried on the place. The police will investigate the matter.

WORLD NEWS BY CABLE

(Associated Press Cable.)

PORT ARTHUR ATTACK. Shanghai, Sept. 21.—The attack on Port Arthur has been resumed at three points.

SITUATION AT FRONT. St. Petersburg, Sept. 21.—The situation at the front is unchanged. Attention has reverted to Port Arthur.

ARGENTINE SHIPS. Buenos Ayres, Sept. 21.—The Minister of Marine denies that any Argentine warships have been sold to Russia.

A BAD BARGAIN. Peking, Sept. 21.—Minister Paul Lesar has demanded that China purchase the Manchurian railway.

DYNAMITE KILLS. Melrose, Mass., Sept. 21.—A street car struck a box of dynamite yesterday which had fallen from a wagon and was blown to pieces. There were nine killed and nineteen injured by the explosion, which was terrific.

CHINA AND THIBET. London, Sept. 21.—It is understood that Shanghai has also objected to the Anglo-Thibetan treaty.
