ROAD BUREAU EXPENSES.

Amounts expended by the road bureau during September are as follows: Pay roll, roads and bridges, Honolulu, \$1,354; roads and bridges, including September bills of \$1,570.47, \$7,326.35, for the Fourth District; for the Fifth District, \$2,570.98, including September bills of \$1,187.87; Fort street extension and right of way, \$1,941.89; Hotel extension and right of way, \$92, roll \$89.50; Kukui extension, bills, \$170.85; School extension, pay roll, \$2,816.36, bills, \$283.92; Palolo new roads, payroll, \$872, bills, \$205.47; stables, Fourth and Fifth Districts, payrolls and bills, \$832.94 and \$2290.77; storm sewers and drains, pay roll, \$548.25; emergency, road damages, pay roll and bills, \$2,159.34; concrete and stone bridge, Waihole, etc., payroll (making pipe) \$138.75. Grand total, \$26,151.47.

CONTRABAND CARGO.

The Toyo Kisen Kaisha steamship America Maru arrived from San Francisco yesterday afternoon and was docked at the Hackfeld wharf at 5:15 o'clock. The Maru had a rather rough passage. She has on board only twenty-one cabin passengers, all of whom are for the Orient. Among them are M. Miyasaki of the T. K. K. Co. and K. Unno, a director of a large tea syndicate.

The Maru carries a full load of cargo for the Orient, which includes a great amount of contraband. The steamship is scheduled to sail at 5 o'clock.

NOW IT WAS PANIC.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 25.—Admiral Rojestvensky's report upon the fisheries incident has not yet been received. There is confidence that the affair will be peacefully adjusted. The cause of the firing upon the trawlers is attributed to a panic.

CRUISERS LEAVE CRONSTADT.

Cronstadt, Oct. 25.—The cruisers Oleg and Lamund have sailed to join the Baltic fleet.

ENGLISH RESENTMENT ALLAYED

London, Oct. 25.—The assurances of the Czar that reparation will be made have somewhat allayed resentment over the firing upon the British fishermen.

JOURNEY OF NOVIK'S CREW.

Vladivostok, Oct. 25.—The officers and crew of the Novik have arrived at Saghalien after a fifty days' journey, suffering great hardships.

SUCCESSFUL AIRSHIP.

St. Louis, Oct. 25.—The airship Baldwin, from San Francisco, made a successful flight of ten miles yesterday.

EPISCOPALS ADJOURN.

Boston, Oct. 25.—The Episcopalian body has adjourned. The next convention will be held in Richmond, Va.

STREET-CAR ACCIDENT.

Seattle, Oct. 25.—In a street car collision here, thirty-five people were injured, two probably fatally.

STRUCK FLOATING MINES.

Chefoo, Oct. 25.—The steamer Washington struck a floating mine near Alceste Island. Two Chinese passengers were killed and three injured by the explosion. The Washington succeeded in reaching Wai-hai-Wai.

NEW YORK POSTMASTER DEAD.

New York, Oct. 25.—Postmaster Van Cott is dead.


