WORLD NEWS BY CABLE

(Associated Press Cable.)

WILL NOT DEPOSE ADMIRAL.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 27.—Admiral Rojstvensky's report has been received with sympathy and confidence. As the mystery is not cleared the outcome will probably be a reference of the report to the mixed tribunal at the Hague to ascertain the truth. It is believed England will accept this proposition. The suggestion that Admiral Rojstvensky be deposed will not be acceded to.

ENGLAND READY TO FIGHT.

London, Oct. 27.—Notwithstanding the diplomatic check caused by Rojstvensky's report, England is preparing for hostile possibilities. Great naval activity continues. The Mediterranean fleet is hastening to Gibraltar.

JAPANESE FORTIFYING.

Mukden, Oct. 27.—There has been desultory firing between the hostile armies. The Japanese are fortifying their whole line. The Russians are re-narrating the Chinese for property destroyed.

CLEARED FOR ACTION.

London, Oct. 27.—The Gibraltar squadron has cleared its decks for action.

BRITISH CABINET MEETS.

London, Oct. 27.—The cabinet will meet at noon. Admiral Rojstvensky's explanation is received with incredulity.

FIRE ON GERMANS.

Berlin, Oct. 27.—It has developed that the Russian warships fired on a German fishing boat off Jutland.

REPAIRING IN SPAIN.

Madrid, Oct. 27.—The Russian warships have been allowed to remain at Vigo to complete repairs.

SUBWAY OPENED.

New York, Oct. 27.—The subway has been opened for business.

WYMAN TO CARTER

Governor Carter is in receipt of the following from Surgeon-General Wyman: Treasury Department, Washington Oct. 9, 1904.

His Excellency, G. R. Carter, Governor Territory of Hawaii, Honolulu T. H.

My Dear Sir:—I have deferred answering your kind invitation to visit the Territory of Hawaii because of my great desire to write a letter of acceptance. Nothing would please me more personally or from a Service standpoint than personal observation of the great work that is going on in Hawaii with reference to health matters and particularly with regard to leprosy. In the meantime, pressing duties in this country have compelled my absence from Washington, which is another reason for my delay in writing.

I regret very much, however, that I cannot see my way clear to leaving the continent for the necessary period before the next session of Congress.

I have read with great interest the wishes of the Board of Health of the Territory of Hawaii with regard to leprosy as set forth in the very able report of the representative of the Board, Dr. C. B. Cooper, and my personal interviews with him during his visit to this city and at the meeting of the American Medical Association at Atlantic City have done much to enlighten me as to what is desired and what may be properly recommended to the general government in the matter of scientific examination into the subject of leprosy, particularly as to the cure and treatment of the lepers. Reported Yamada Defeat Lone Tree Hill Story

St. Petersburg, Oct. 26.—The suspension of operations below Mukden continues. It is hinted in military circles that the next developments should be looked for eastward, but whether on the part of Japanese or Russians is not revealed.

No news has reached the War Office of the reported annihilation of a Russian battalion while re-crossing the Taitse river.

A dispatch from General Sakharoff, dated last night, reports that all was quiet along the front yesterday and that in spite of the soggy condition of the country roads, which are described as seas of mud, the Russian scouts continue to show great enterprise in examining the Japanese positions. A detachment of 200 Cossacks Tuesday night reconnoitered the Japanese left southwestward along a line extending westward from the railroad where it crosses the Schill river, through the villages of Haisantal, Tadousampu and Sandepu, the latter fifteen miles west of the railroad. The Japanese sentinels fired and retreated as the Cossacks rode rapidly along the line, but near Sandepu the Cossacks unexpectedly ran into a good-sized Japanese force, with machine guns. The latter opened a murderous fire on the Russians, killing many horses and mortally wounding Captain Turgenieff, but all the Cossacks succeeded in getting away. Not one was killed on the field.


No statement is made as to what is transpiring on the Russian left.

The War Office is now disposed to believe that the Tokio report of the drubbing given to General Yamada's brigade is the Japanese version of the capture of Lone Tree Hill, nicely turned to minimize its importance.

The reports that Generals Rennenkampf and Meyendorff are wounded are denied. The former's chief of staff, Colonel Rossitsky, was wounded.
