SOME APPLICANTS ALSO TRIED FOR WEST POINT

QUESTIONS SIMILAR TO THOSE ASKED AT ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS AT ANNAPOLIS.

The examination of candidates for the cadetship at Annapolis began Wednesday. Seven applicants appeared out of whom three had already taken the examination for West Point. These three were Fred Ober, Samuel Wilder King and William Kirkby Tucker. The full list of candidates for Annapolis is as follows:
