MAUNA LOA IN PORT The Mauna Loa arrived from Kauai, Kona and Maui ports this morning with 42 cabin passengers and a cargo including 3248 bags of sugar, 157 bags coffee, 30 head of cattle, and sundries. Pursuer Conkling reports as follows: "On outward trip experienced northerly swell, and south winds accompanied by showers. In Kauai it was showery with choppy seas and but little wind. At Punaluu a high surf was running, making the work very difficult. We discharged there first and then went to Honouapou finishing discharging Kauai freight and taking sugar. Could get no report of sugar from Hamakua. There have been light showers at Kauai and good rains in Kona. Both plantations in Kauai have ceased grinding until the first of next month. Sugar on Hawaii: Punaluu, 1600 bags."

MUST SHIP NEW CREW. Only five men of the crew of the Sierra were released from quarantine, and these were all heads of departments. The others, on account of the case of smallpox on board, are detained at Angel Island. It will be necessary to ship a complete new crew on the Sierra for her next voyage to Australia. She is to sail a week from today.—San Francisco Chronicle.

WORLD NEWS BY CABLE

STORM AT MIDWAY. Midway Island, July 20.—A terrific storm has swept this island. The camp of the United States marines has been destroyed. Midway Island, July 21.—The local office of the cable company received a dispatch early this morning stating that the weather had cleared up and that the storm was over.

CHINA ASSERTS RIGHTS. Washington, July 20.—China has notified the powers that she will not recognize any disposition of Manchuria unless she is consulted with regard to it. KOMURA EN ROUTE. Seattle, July 20.—Baron Komura has departed for New York. ARMY WOULD FIGHT. Gunshu Pass, July 20.—A prominent Russian commander has declared that the army does not share the peace desires of the government. RUSSIAN CROP FAILURE. St. Petersburg, July 20.—Several sections report hot winds which have aggravated the deplorable crop conditions now prevailing in many parts of the empire. INVESTIGATE INSURANCE. Albany, July 20.—A committee of the New York state legislature has been appointed to investigate the life insurance companies. DISORDERS IN SPAIN. Seville, July 20.—There have been serious disorders here arising from the general distress. GREAT STRIKE ENDED. Chicago, July 20.—The great teamsters' strike has been called off. GOVERNMENT DEFEATED. London, July 20.—The government was defeated in the House of Commons yesterday by a majority of three. The vote was on a motion to reduce the membership from Ireland.

NEW BUILDINGS FOR OAHU COLLEGE DISCUSSED The annual meeting of the trustees of Oahu College was held in the office of P. C. Jones yesterday afternoon. Prof. W. D. Alexander and Judge S. B. Dole were re-elected trustees. Other officers elected were: President, A. F. Griffiths; vice-president, W. D. Alexander; treasurer, P. C. Jones; secretary, A. F. Judd; auditor, C. H. Cooke. The treasurer reported the corporation out of debt, with \$80,000 on hand to put into new buildings. A general plan for laying out the grounds and for future building was reported by the committee in charge. The present idea is to remove all the old buildings save Bingham hall and confine all school buildings to between Paohai hall and C. R. Bishop hall. Two dormitories and the boarding department will be placed mauka of Bishop hall. The pasture will be made into an athletic field. Walter Dillingham, A. F. Judd and Clarence Cooke were appointed to consult with the architect. Construction on the dormitories will begin soon.

A BUSY BARKENTINE. The 4-masted barkentine Georgina, which arrived July 5 from Honolulu and docked yesterday at Howard street wharf No. 2, is one of the busiest sailing vessels owned at this port. Since 1901, when she was launched at Fairhaven, she has been in constant commission, sailing off shore most of the time. This is only the third time she has visited her home port and she will not be here very long. She goes from here to Portland, where she will load lumber for San Pedro. Although four years old, the Georgina has been so well cared for that she still looks a new vessel.—San Francisco Chronicle.
