

WORLD NEWS BY CABLE

(Associated Press Cable.) INVESTIGATING BOYCOTT. Washington, Feb. 6.—The Senate has passed a resolution providing for an investigation of the Chinese boycott.

ANTI-FOREIGN FEELING. London, Feb. 6.—Advisers received here are to the effect that the anti-foreign feeling is spreading rapidly in China.

LEAD SEPARATE PARTIES. London, Feb. 6.—In the event of the re-election of Balfour to Parliament, he will remain the leader of the Conservatives, while Chamberlain will lead the tariff men with a separate organization.

REVOLUTION IN PEACE. St. Petersburg, Feb. 6.—The elections for the new National Assembly will take place on April 7th, and the Assembly will meet on the 25th of the same month.

REVOLUTIONISTS EXECUTED. Libau, Feb. 6.—Thirteen revolutionists have been executed here.

INVESTIGATE VALENCIA. Washington, Feb. 6.—President Roosevelt has ordered a commission to investigate the loss of the steamer Valencia.

FUNERAL OF CHRISTIAN. Copenhagen, Feb. 6.—The funeral of the late King Christian will take place on February 13.

KAUAI FRUIT CO. WANTS A CHARTER

Application for a charter for the Kauai Fruit & Land Co. was filed with the Treasurer yesterday. The officers are: President, T. C. Davies; vice president, W. A. Kinney; treasurer, F. M. Swany; and secretary Ernest H. Wodehouse. The capital stock is \$20,000.

It is stated that the objects of the incorporation are to raise and prepare for market fruits and sugar, to erect canneries, buy or acquire lands and generally do all the things that a plantation company or a fruit company may find it convenient to do under its charter. And the proposed charter contains this provision:

"All stock of the proposed corporation issued prior to July 1, 1905, shall be subject to the right of the McBryde Sugar Company, Limited, to acquire and purchase the same from the original or any subsequent holder thereof, at par, and an additional sum equivalent to eight per cent per annum, semi-annually, on said stock from the incorporation of this company to the date said stock is taken over as aforesaid; provided that the McBryde Sugar Company, Limited, acquires and pays for said stock on or before July 1, 1905."

The next section provides that the stock of the new corporation can be called in by the directors thereof upon the demand of the McBryde Sugar Company, and gives the directors power to compel the return of such stock by suit; and upon its recovery to deliver it all to the McBryde Sugar Company upon the payment of the stipulated price.

Owing to the peculiarity of the provisions quoted, which appear to create a company within a company, the charter was referred to the Attorney General for an opinion.


