ROOSEVELT FOR RE-ELECTION.

Birmingham, New York, March 15.—Judge Alton B. Parker, in an interview, has stated that he is convinced that President Roosevelt desires a re-election.

WEEDON'S SUMMONS WAS ANACHRONISTIC

E. M. Watson moves to quash summons in the suits of W. C. Weedon against Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Chapin. Weedon wants damages for injuries he received from a fall from his horse, which ailed at the Chapin auto. Watson shows that the return on the summons against Mrs. Chapin was served on February 6, an impossible thing, as it was not issued before February 26. As other grounds Watson shows the following:

That it does not appear from the record that at the time of the issue of the pretended original summons there was filed with the clerk any petition or declaration in the action, such filing being made by law a prerequisite to the issuing of such writ.

That the summons was not issued in conformity with any prayer thereof contained in any petition on file in the court.

That the summons does not fix a return day thereof as required by law.

That the pretended copy of the summons is not certified as required by law.


