Chinese After Control
Victoria Colonist

Victoria, B. C., Sept. 1.—In entering
a general denial of the persistent re-
port that he is now one of the heaviest
shareholders in the Colonist news-
paper, Lee Mong Kow has rather
strengthened the belief in the widely
circulated story that Chinese capital-
ists are seeking to secure a chain of
newspapers wholly or partially across
Canada wherewith to conduct an en-
ergetic campaign for the abolition of the
\$500 capita tax.
Mong Kow declared that he held no
Colonist stock. The rumor had prob-
ably arisen, he explained, owing to
the intention of a number of leading
Chinese to establish a morning daily
newspaper at Vancouver. Other Chi-
nese declare that if plans now on foot
are carried out the ensuing six months
will see established in Victoria a
morning newspaper conducted by the
best and most experienced journalists
available, and which will not suffer
through any inadequacy of plant or
shortage of running capital. The plans
of the Chinese are said to include daily
journals in this city, Vancouver, Ed-
monton, Winnipeg, Montreal and
Fredericton, N. B.
