First quarter of the moon Nov. 22. *Times of these tides not stated in tables. Times of the tide are taken from the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. Hawaiian standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 9 hours 9 minutes. Sun and moon are for local time for the whole group.

KELLY WILL COMMAND BARK ANDREW WELCH

The bark Andrew Welch, Captain McPhail, arrived from San Francisco at 10:15 o'clock this morning, with a general cargo of freight. There were no unusual incidents aboard during the voyage. Head winds and seas were experienced during a large part of the trip, but the latter part of the voyage was marked by fine weather.

The bark brings to Honolulu a general cargo, including some lumber. She had also four passengers, not including the captain's family, his wife and daughter.

Captain Kelly, formerly master of the ship George Curtis, is to take command of the Andrew Welch here. He came down on one of the steamers recently, having left the Curtis at San Francisco.

ORIENTAL DAY IN THE POLICE COURT

The time of the Police Court today has been taken up almost entirely with Chinese and Japanese cases. This morning was largely devoted to hearing the complaints against six Chinese accused of perjury. These cases all arise out of the Chinese feud which has been occupying the time of the Court for some weeks back. No decision was arrived at today, the cases being continued to November 30. The men on trial are Lam Man Blu, Wo Hong Cho, W. W. Ahana, Chan Oou and Lau Shee.

This afternoon Judge Whitney heard the cases against Kimura and Tsurushima of the Japanese Hawaiian Chronicle, accused of criminal libel against Dr. Achina. Both the defendants were held for trial in the Circuit Court, but being fixed at \$100 in each case, in each of the two charges against the men.

The Board of Directors of the Merchants' Association will meet this afternoon to consider recommendations for harbor improvements.

The steamer Nihau arrived from Waimea this morning. Her only passengers were two Japanese. A pile-driving hammer was included in her cargo. Purser Hart reports 2500 bags of sugar on hand at the Kekaha sugar mill.
