### RED MEN.

Order in Splendid Condition.

Along the Trail.

I am pleased to have the honor to report that the order is in splendid condition throughout the great reservation. While from peculiar circumstances in one or two localities the tribes have failed to prosper and have accomplished little or nothing during the great year, the general situation is most gratifying. Harmony, prosperity and numerical and financial increase mark the zealous effort of the chiefs and brothers. Our order has made most satisfactory gains and is today stronger in numbers, better fitted to accomplish the beneficent, social and patriotic purposes for which it was organized and in greater accord as a fraternity than at any period of its existence. Great incomes.

Eleven new tribal brands have been lighted in the Pennsylvania reservation since last year.

The Improved Order of Red Men is steadily and rapidly approaching the half million mark in the size of its membership.

Past Grand Incomet Thomas G. Harrison was recently elected great chief of records of Indiana for the nineteenth time.

In the Maine reservation during the past nine months twelve new tribal fires were lighted and nine councils of Pocahontas instituted.

The order now has three active tribes of Red Men in the Philippines, Aztec tribe having consolidated with Red Cloud tribe.

### KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS.

New Grand Chancellor of Illinois. Pythian Briefs.

The newly elected grand chancellor of Illinois, Frank C. Smith, has been a member of the order ever since he was old enough to join it and for a number of years was an officer of the grand lodge. He was born in Casey-

ville, Ill., in 1862, was educated in the public schools and in a business college and for a time was chief train dispatcher of the Alton road. Meanwhile he had studied for the bar, and in 1885 in his home town of East St. Louis he began the practice of law and was appointed a master in chancery in 1900. Mr. Smith served last year as vice chancellor of the grand lodge of Illinois.

Recent reports from Texas show the Pythians of the Lone Star domain to be in a most flourishing condition. The membership is about 22,000.

One thing that is needed in all lodges is a committee that will make it its duty to make the newly initiated and visitors feel at home.

The endowment rank has \$115,287,500 protection in force. It has \$1,200,000 on hand as an emergency fund.

The supreme chancellor recently ruled that an Indian is not eligible to become a member of the order.

The total assets of the order, according to the latest report of the supreme keeper of records and seal, are over \$12,000,000.

### MODERN WOODMEN.

Large Gains Made in 1905—From Various States.

The order increased 42,431 in membership during the first six months of 1905, and large gains were made during the balance of the year.

A class of 201 candidates was initiated by the Modern Woodmen of Milwaukee recently.

On Nov. 1 the Wisconsin jurisdiction had over 53,000 members in good standing.

There are now over 15,000 members of the order in New York state.

Good gains in membership were made in Nebraska during the past year, and the jurisdiction now numbers over 43,000 members.



The Foresters of America recently initiated a class of 1,400 candidates in New York city.

The Ladies of the Macawbees has made large gains in membership during the year 1905 and is in a most flourishing condition.
