# SUGAR

Willett & Gray report as follows on the raw sugar market for January 10. RAW SUGAR.—No business has been done during the week under review to warrant a change in the quotation of spot or nearby sugars, hence we continue to quote at 3.50c. per pound duty paid for spot values as per last sale.

There has been business in January and first half of February shipment at a reduction of 2 1/2-3 1/2c. per pound c. and f. for 96 test Cuba centrifugals, equal to 2.52c. duty paid, and of Porto Rico centrifugals for January-February shipment at 2.50c., basis 96 test.

Buyers are now looking for Cuba centrifugals at 2 1/2c. c. and f. 96 test, while sellers have large supplies on offer at last quotations for January-February shipments. Indications are that a slight concession will soon be granted in order to effect sales.

There is no change in final quotations of beet sugar at 8s. 9 1/2d., although during the week the price dropped to 8s. 8 1/2d. There is no definite trend in the European market just now and minor fluctuations occur each week. Beet interest dropped to 9s. during the week, but closed at 9s. 0 1/2d.

The Cuban situation is watched in Europe with special interest. Our special reports from Cuba given herewith are quite reassuring regarding the safety of the present crop of 1906-1907, whatever may be the outcome of the 1907-crop should American protection be withdrawn.

It is not well to give full credence to current so-called information in the newspapers, much of which is written to force public opinion in favor of annexation or permanent Protectorate. The trend at present is towards establishment of a Cuban independent government, but with an American Advisory Committee remaining in the island.

It is scarcely likely that any important change in the status of the island will take place during the making of the present sugar crop. The length of the grinding season depends largely upon the weather, the present conditions of which being favorable.

During the last week or two, there were sold to Canadian buyers some 5000 tons Demerara centrifugals at equal to 2c. c. and f., New York, basis 96 test.

Recent sales have been made of San Domingo molasses sugars, for shipment to the United Kingdom, which will net the sellers fully 3-16c. per pound more than the value here. Indications are

# NO SPECIAL FAVORS FOR RICH OR POOR

All Stand Alike Before Court, Says Judge Robinson

Judge Robinson intends that every man who appears before him in his court shall stand on the same ground as every other man. The matter of riches or poverty is to be allowed to cut no figure. Because a man is poor is no reason why his punishment should be a light one if he has been found guilty of an offense against the law. And because a man is rich is no reason why his punishment should be greater than that of a poor man found guilty of a similar offense. Judge Robinson laid down his position in the matter this morning in passing sentence on Kajuta, the Japanese who was found guilty last week of assault with a weapon "obviously and luminently dangerous to life," as the charge was charged. Kajuta has been employed as a laborer on the inter-island boats. He came up for sentence this morning, and his attorney, William T. Rawlins, asked that the court be lenient in passing sentence because Kajuta was a poor man. Humphreys, attorney for the prosecution, started to object, but the judge took the words out of his mouth, and stated that the man's poverty could cut no figure in the matter. "That," he said, "has always been my rule. Neither rich nor poor have any special privileges before this court. Sentences should be passed, not only in the way of punishment, but as a deterrent to others who may be minded to violate the law." The Judge then imposed a fine of \$50 and costs, amounting in all to \$68.00. Kajuta, although a poor man, making, according to his attorney, from \$5 to \$7.50 a week, and, also, according to his own statement, sending home to his wife and two children in Japan about \$20 a month, paid the fine and costs, and was released.
