### SPORTING GOSSIP

The Rugby Union of Queensland has appropriated the sum of £2000 towards the expenses of a football team to make a tour of the United States and play with college teams.

Rowing seems to be the real thing just now in California college circles. Besides the eight-oared race in which the college crews will take part, Stanford has received an offer to send her four-oared crew to Southern California and take part in two races, one at Los Angeles and the other at San Diego. The offer will probably be accepted and the races take place during the Easter vacation.

The New York Nationals will train in California this season and our own Barney Joy may get a chance to stack up against them in some of the practice games.

In a race on Washington's Birthday between the crews from the cruises Charlestown and Boston, the latter won by half a length. The race was three miles in length and was rowed in four-oared shells belonging to the San Diego Rowing Club.

The University of Washington wants to row a yearly race with Stanford's eight-oared crew. The plans propose that the race shall be rowed at Seattle and Sausalito on alternate years.

Joe Gans refuses to meet Harry Lewis as he will not stand for a 60-10 per cent division of the gate receipts. Gans wants the division to be 25 and 75 per cent.

The eight-oared race between Harvard and Cornell will probably be held on the Charles River at Cambridge instead of on Lake Cayuga. The lake steambot companies which furnish the excursion boats for the day refuse to meet terms in regard to the position which they shall keep while the race is in progress.

A ten-mile swimming race, for which prizes worth \$10,000 will be offered, is to take place in the Mississippi River at St. Louis in the near future. The event will be for amateurs and the best men from all over the United States are expected to compete.

Another American tennis team will visit England this year in an effort to bring back the Dwight Davis Cup to its home. Last year the chances of the American team were ruined when Beals Wright, then champion of the United States, cut his hand and blood poisoning ensued. It may be of interest to know that Wright is the son of George Wright, the most marvelous shortstop who every played baseball, and a nephew of Harry Wright, the famous manager-captain of the Philadelphia Red Stockings.

Yale has already commenced the erection of a new swimming tank to be 70x20 feet in size. This was made possible by a gift of \$40,000 from Andrew Carnegie.

Jimmy Smith did some nice bowling on the Tuxedo alleys in Newark, N. J., early last month. He rolled a perfect score of 300 and in eight games made the remarkable average of 224.

The yachting event of the season on the Great Lakes will be a big open regatta which will be given by the Lakewood Yacht Club.

It is expected that Hitachiyama, said to be one of the finest wrestlers in Japan, will pass through here in April and may stop off and give an exhibition in this city.

## TRACK GAME AT PUNAHOU

The interclass games were held at Punahou yesterday afternoon, resulting in a victory for the Juniors, Freshmen and Preparatory school, who were lined up against the Seniors, Post Graduates and Sophomores, by a score of 58½ to 44½ points. The games were exciting and interesting throughout and some very creditable records were made by some of the young athletes. When the condition of the track is considered and compared with the last tracks which are used in the States, some of the records are really remarkable.
