WATERFRONT NOTES. CAPTAIN FRED MATHIESON, who piloted the bark Irigard in from the Hilo ship Saturday, was the last pilot to leave the port of Honolulu.

Mathieson glanced over at the America. All hands were busy getting all on the schooner. Every attch that the America's sticks would stand was soon set and drawing, and the trim little schooner, deck half submerged, began to slip through the water like a thing lewitched.

Mathieson rounded the fort Captain Mathieson, looking through a pair of marine glasses, discovered the America coming to an anchorage off Meigs wharf—Call.

While entering the port of San Juan Cruz with a cargo of 14,000 tons of sugar from Hawaii, the American Hawaiian steamer Columbia went on the mud and stuck fast for several hours.
