## EUCALYPTUS TREATMENT BEST FOR LEPROSY

Dr. Goodhue has made a very extended report on the work done at the Leprosy Settlement during the past year, indicating the different kinds of treatment which are being tried there, and the remedies which he thinks are the most advantageous.

The eucalyptus treatment is the one which seems to be most generally applied for by the lepers, and, according to Dr. Goodhue, seems to do the most towards producing the desired effect. No cures have as yet been accomplished, but this is probably due to the fact that the only cases on which Goodhue has had an opportunity to work so far are of from five to twenty-five years' duration. He believes, however, that it would be possible to cure a case in the first stages by this treatment. Dr. Goodhue makes the statement that leprosy, so far as our present knowledge goes, is emphatically a surgical disease.
