Fine Waialua Meeting. Lane, Desha, Kekekolo, Wm. Ahia, E. W. Quinn, Hughes, Watkins, Henriques and Aylett returned this morning from Waialua, after having been stumping with the other Republican candidates on the round-the-island tour.

They will return this evening, together with the candidates for Representatives from the Fifth District, to Pearl City, where a big meeting will be held.

The candidates report that they held a rousing meeting at Waialua last evening, all the white and nearly all

the Hawaiian voters of the district being present.

Punchbowl Situation. The situation among the Portuguese voters appears to be rather mixed. From the statements of those who claim to speak with authority it would seem that the majority of this vote will go to Lane for Mayor, Jarrett for Sheriff, Rose for Deputy Sheriff and Hughes, Moore and Quinn for Senators.

Thwing Affirms Report. Thwing this noon affirmed the report, published exclusively by the Bulletin yesterday, that he would give the candidacy of Iaukea a boost before the Hawaiian Evangelical Association next Monday. Thwing stated that he was preparing a speech in which he would outline various reform campaigns, and would refer to Iaukea in this connection as the man who would carry out the laws.

After Egg Throwers. Sheriff Iaukea stated this noon that the would take special steps to have egg throwers arrested should they annoy the political speakers of any party. He would have plain clothes men stationed at each meeting, and it would go hard with any offender who was apprehended.

Umauna Is Hijacked. The noon hour politics was kept up today by the representatives of different parties. The speakers were Sam Kaloa and Kauwe of the Democratic party, Umauna and Kanioa of the

Home Rule-Labor party and a few others.

The Republican party was not represented on the soap box. None of the candidates for Mayor were present, although it was reported this morning that John C. Lane would be there to deliver the goods.

C. K. Farden, who filed his nomination papers for Representative, has written to Secretary Mott-Smith, withdrawing his name, and suggesting that the name of H. Kahauloilo be substituted. The latter mailed his nomination papers, but Mr. Mott-Smith will advise him that the only way he can be recognized will be to file his nomination with the Inspectors of Election. His name may then be written on the ballot.
