Kamakau Objects To Officials Riding In Hack of Japanese

S. M. Kamakau who states that he drives hack number 123 called at the Bulletin office this forenoon and told a story of Territorial officials riding in Japanese hacks.

Kamakau states that he was at the steamer this morning when the Territorial Land Commissioner and the Superintendent of Public Works arrived from Kauai. He asked them if they wanted a hack. They said an automobile was more to their liking but they did not find one. Finally they rode off toward home in a Japanese hack, the number of which Kamakau gives as 158.

Kamakau got one passenger and happened to go in the same direction. He says he met the Japanese hackman, who asked him why it was that these passengers of his made him sign a paper for two dollars fare. Kamakau presumes that he was asked to sign a voucher to be turned in on expense account.

Kamakau takes the position that he was discriminated against in favor of the non-citizen. He is a well known Hawaiian.

APPLICANTS SHUN THE EXAMINATION

Of the thirty-three men who registered as applicants for the position of dredging inspector for the Pearl Harbor work, but fifteen appeared this morning to take the examination. As there is but one vacancy, the authorities do not anticipate any difficulty in securing an eligible for the position.

The examination is being held today in the sheds at the Naval Station under the direction of four officers of the Navy. The candidates received their instructions at 9 o'clock this morning and will remain in the examination room until 3 o'clock this afternoon, the law specifying that the examination shall last for six hours.

The duties of the dredging inspector consist of keeping tab on the work done by the dredge on which he may be stationed. He resides on board the dredge as the accredited representative of the Navy Department, and must make sure that the dredge which he is responsible is doing its work in compliance with the terms of the contract between the company and the government.

NO OFFICIAL NEWS OF BIG MARINE GARRISON

No official communications regarding a garrison of 1500 marines for Pearl Harbor, have been received here. The rumor originated with a non-commissioned officer of marines, lately from Washington, who passed through here on the Buford.

Some color is lent to the rumor, however, by the fact that the withdrawal of the marines from war vessels will leave some 2500 men more than there are garrison accommodations for in the United States. The total strength of the Marine Corps, at the present time, is 9100—268 officers and 8826 enlisted men. Of this force, ninety officers and 3026 enlisted men are stationed in the boundaries of the United States, and 178 officers and 5800 men outside.

If the large marine garrison be sent here, it is not considered likely that it will in any way affect the local marine garrison. The new troops, in all probability, would be sent directly to Pearl Harbor.

C. Harley McBride Cables For \$60 To Get To Honolulu

To Mott-Smith, Honolulu. "Governor due. Me Alameda. Need sixty for passage money."

McBRIDE. Away up in the great city where the bright lights are always shining, where wine blows like the waters of Pauoa Springs, there is one Claudius Harley McBride, secretary to the Governor, wanting the necessary money for first class passage on the ferry-boat Alameda to Honolulu. When McBride "goes broke" in a far and foreign city, he rushes to the cable office almost by instinct, certainly by training.

Mott-Smith says that McBride is probably mistaken when he says the Governor is due, though the latter may arrive soon.

MAHUKONA TROUBLE TO BE ENDED SOON

The end of the Mahukona landing fight is at last in sight. Marston Campbell has communicated with the parties concerned, and is at present only awaiting an answer from his letters to finish the whole business up.

A new scheme has been laid out whereby two separate runways down the wharf will be constructed, so that the passenger traffic will not interfere with the trains and freight.

ELKS NEW HOME

New York, Dec. 4.—Elks in New York are to spend \$1,000,000 on a new clubhouse, hotel and theater, to be erected at Forty-third street, near Sixth avenue. Work on the structure, which will be built by Noew York Lodge No. 1, will begin within sixty days. The building, according to present plans, will be twelve stories high and will be dedicated on Christmas eve, 1909. The chairman of the board of trustees in speaking of the project says:

"It will be a general meeting place for the 250,000 Elks who are residents of the United States, 10,000 of whom live in the city of New York."






