ARMY, NAVY AND MARINE CORPS

Major General Weston has designated from January 20 to April 19, both dates inclusive, as next year's season for target practise in the Philippines.

Organizations having to pursue the target course at stations other than their own will be allowed an extension of the season to include June 30, 1909.

The division rifle and pistol competitions will be held at Fort William McKinley, Rizal, beginning May 3, 1909, in accordance with the provisions of Part VII, Small Arms Firing Regulations. Skirmish fire for Philippine Scouts in instruction and record practice will be conducted with the equipment prescribed in paragraph 7a, General Orders, No. 177, War Department, series 197, excepting that the following articles will be omitted from the blanket roll: 5 shelter-tent pins, 1 shelter-tent pole, and 1 blanket.

For this practice, and until the adoption of a new method of carrying the Scout equipment, the blanket roll will be carried in the manner prescribed in the Infantry Drill Regulations and not as directed in General Orders No. 20, Headquarters Philippines Division, Series 1907.

General Grant has reported to the War Department that the bakers' and cooks' schools at the Washington barracks have continued successfully under the supervision of Captain F. J. Koester of the subsistence department. "Through them," says General Grant, "this department is rapidly being supplied with trained bakers and cooks who are capable of preparing the army ration properly and of giving the maximum amount of nourishment and satisfaction. Good health, contentment and greater efficiency among the soldiers have consequently resulted. The courses in these schools are very complete, covering the preparation of the army ration, the baking of all kinds of bread used both in garrison and in the field, besides fancy breads and pastries, and a practical course, including the proper method of the cooking of every article of food used in the Army.

The following transfers in the Philippines have been ordered consequent upon the abandonment of Boac as a military post:
First Lieut. Frederic E. Jenkins, Medical Reserve Corps, now at Hong, will be relieved from duty and will, after final disposition of all property for which he is accountable, proceed to Camp Gregg, Pangasinan, reporting upon arrival to the commanding officer for duty.

Captain Louis Brechemin Jr., Medical Corps, now on temporary duty at Camp Gregg, will, upon arrival of First Lieut. Jenkins at that station, proceed to Fort William McKinley, Rizal, for permanent station, reporting upon arrival to the commanding officer for duty.

The authorities of the War Department have decided that the law prohibiting military bands from taking outside employment in competition with civilian bands applies not only to the band as an organization, but to the individual members thereof as well. In explanation of the action of the Department it is stated that the members of Army bands have been recently granted a substantial increase of pay in consideration of the outside patronage, of which they were deprived by the restrictive legislation relating to outside employment.

Importance of lessening the baggage carried by the enlisted men of the Army is forcefully set out in various reports of the department commanders to the Secretary of War. Various articles now carried by the soldier, it is suggested, might be very profitably dropped to the end of lightening his burden without sacrificing anything absolutely necessary for his comfort and convenience.
