# BOARD APPROVES ROAD PAY ROLLS

## Remarkable Exhibition Of Verbosity Is Given

If the first meetings of the Board of Supervisors were lively, the meeting of the Board yesterday afternoon was the most tiresome exhibition of driveling, cud-chewing verbosity, reason apparently having fled for the time being from the assembly room of the County fathers.  
Fern announced that it was time to reconsider the date for tenders. Logan moved to do so. This carried, and the date was changed from the 25th to the 27th.  
Kane handed in the salary demands on the Committee on Roads, Bridges, Parks, and Garbage Departments.  
Ahia moved to adopt the report. Aylett seconded.  
"It is up to the Supervisors themselves to pass this," said Fern. "I have already stated my position at the last meeting."  
The report was adopted on the usual vote, and Ahia moved that the Auditor be authorized to draw the warrants to the persons named in the demands. The Mayor refused to put the motion, and it was passed on Logan calling his moult in the usual style.  
Logan reported for the committee on the Lincoln celebration, stating that the general meeting held on this matter had been attended to. He also reported on the Bonine matter, stating that the proposition of having motion pictures taken of the Fire Department in action had been referred to Chief Thurston.  
Superintendent of Public Works Campbell wrote asking that the famous old "China" engine, which was now not in use, be returned to the Territory for use in a locality which was now without fire protection.  
The Mayor stated he understood the engine was to be sent to Maui. Some discussion followed, Fern objecting to letting the engine go, while Cox and Aylett explained that the engine belonged to the Territory anyhow and could not be kept by the County. McClellan wanted a committee, appointed to look into the matter. Kalauekalani said that under an agreement made by the first Board of Supervisors the County was bound to return any of the property which the Territory had turned over to the County. After considerable further discussion, in which verbosity was far more prominent than any particular show of intelligence, the motion to refer to a special committee was lost, Logan this time voting with Democrat McClellan. Aylett's motion to grant the request carried unanimously.  
The Board adjourned until 1 p. m. today.
